Foundation & DIA team to bring Inside|Out back to Sterling Heights

The Sterling Heights Community Foundation and the Detroit Institute of Arts (DIA) are bringing art back to the Sterling Heights City Center for the second time in as many years. The DIA recently announced that Sterling Heights would again be a featured community in this year's popular Inside|Out program, which brings high-quality reproductions of masterpieces from the DIA's collection to the public spaces of metro Detroit. Sterling Heights last hosted the exhibit in the summer of 2011.

Sterling Heights will host the Inside|Out program in Summer 2013 to coincide with the 33rd Annual Sterlingfest Art & Music Fair in July. Specific exhibit dates, paintings and locations will be announced this spring.

Community Foundation marks 2012 Achievements

In its 22 year history, the Sterling Heights Community Foundation has sponsored programs and projects that touch virtually every segment of the city's population. No matter your age, gender or race, the foundation has been a central force in enhancing cultural, educational and recreational opportunities for all residents of this great city. Last year was no exception:

- In January, the Community Foundation announced the establishment of the newly formed Wujek-Calcaterra and Sons Endowment Fund.
- In February, the Community Foundation approved funding for the Dodge Park 5k Run.
- In April, the foundation approved funding for the 14th Annual Ray Filipchuk Memorial Charity Golf Outing.
- In May, the Community Foundation awarded 23 scholarships totaling \$16,500 to students pursuing college educations and/or vocational training.
- In June, City Council presented the Sterling Heights Community Foundation with the "2012 Board of the Year" award.
- In September, BAE established an endowment fund dedicated to scholarships for students pursuing a college degree in science, technology or math.
